Class Attendance and Tardiness

Attendance is taken weekly. Please notify your child's teacher the week prior to or following any absence. Children can only miss 3 classes per semester, especially if the child is in a sacramental year (1st and 2nd years of First Communion preparation and 1st year Confirmation preparation). The year will not be considered complete with more than 3 absences (3 per semester). Please ensure your child arrives on time for class. We have a limited time to share with them and we must take advantage of every minute possible. Four tardy arrivals will count as one absence.

Arrival and Dismissal

For grades Pre-K through 5th students must be walked to classroom and picked up in the same manner. Parents or guardians must pick-up their children and must use their authorized pick up cards which was issued up registration. This card must be presented to the teacher every time. **No child will be dismissed without this card.** If you're late picking up your child, you must come to the Religious Education Office, present the card and sign them out. Excessive tardy pick-ups will be subject to a late fee. Consult the back of your pick up card for details.
